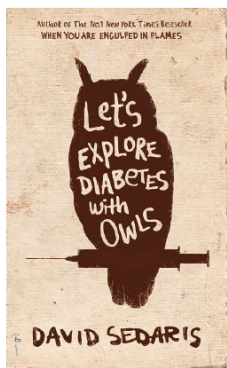

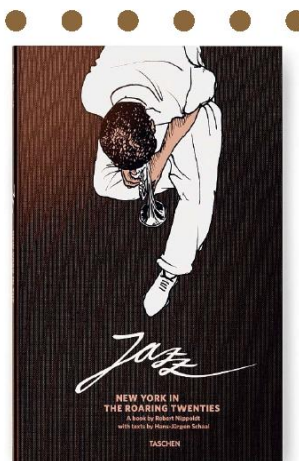
Click eats
